This award will recognize a programmatic effort or an ongoing collaborative program/series/initiative made by an individual or an organization/department on campus, or the campus as a whole, that impacted students, staff, and/or faculty in the area of social justice.

Eligible Nominations*

Eligible nominations will include programs/initiatives primarily coordinated and/or sponsored by housing/residential life departments who are members of UMR-ACUHO. This coordination may be in conjunction with other campus departments, as long as the program/initiative is in some way supported by housing/residential life. Programs/initiatives may be organized by professional staff, student staff, hall government organizations, campus organizations/departments and/or students living in the residence halls. Nominated programs/initiatives must be non-contractual in nature.

*Eligible nominations must also be those having occurred between August 1, 2008 and July 31, 2009.

Process for Submitting Nominations

The outstanding program/initiative will be announced at the UMR-ACUHO Conference each year. Nominations for the 2008-2009 Social Justice Action Award will be accepted until **October 1, 2009**.
